




Dues for the coming year are due.

In March, the club spotlighted OCMC member Joyce Basch, "Ms.gician"

Joyce has been a OCMC board member in the past. She was the Treasure of OCMC and also the 24th president of the club in 1989.

In her 40s, she decided she wanted to learn magic. She went to library Los Alamitos, there was a magic shop. She took her 1st lesson there.

Here favorite trick to perform was her own, she created Bashe's Baseball pitch with baseball cards. It is a humorous trick. Joyce marketed Bashe's Baseball pitch through The Linking Ring.

Joyce had performed the Cords of Phastasia for a children's show at the Magic Castle. She has also performed at many resorts. One funny moment, at a restaurant in Barbados, just had just changed from tennis shoes into high heels to perform, shortly thereafter, a waitress says to Joyce, "Is the Magic in your shoes?". They don't get to see to many magicians on that island.


She is the 1st magician in the world to perform on all 7 continents. Companies would provide Joyce the transportation for free for her performances. She made a lot of tips.

In 1993, Joyce performed in Antarctica.

She went to the Polish Science Center station in Antarctica. Joyce likes whales.

Joyce says that It wasn't a typical gig.

Brad opened up meeting, Todd demonstrated his Irish accent. Ed had a nice Irish outfit. Everyone chatted for a few moments.

Joy gave us an update that we have our back account open. Next project is to get the website up.

Brad spoke of upcoming lectures. Matt Fore is a comedy magician lecturing in May.

Phil spoke of the website TheOCMC.com.

At 7:30, Brad introduced our performers for tonight's Show & Tell.

All the effects and presentations tonight were fantastic.

Up first was Ram. Ram showed us his own version and handling of the Jumping Gemini card trick from Darwin Ortiz which uses 4 cards.

Although, Ram only has four cards, he actually shows us 12 cards. First, the 2 of Hearts, then the 10 of Spades, finally the Queen of Diamonds.

The cards changed three times in very baffling ways. Very nicely done!

Ed Smith was up next to perform a mentalism effect with 5 cards he'd done before; however, tonight, in celebration of St Patrick's Day, each of the cards had an Irish themed design: One a Shamrock, A Leprechaun, A pot of Gold, Green Hat, and a Greenish Beer Mug.

In addition, Ed had a 2nd set of face-down cards

Phil volunteered to assist Ed and try to match the face-down cards with the face-up cards.

Ed took the face-down cards and mixed them up

Phil would then direct Ed into placing each face-down card under one of the face-up cards.

Ed holds the 2nd card and Phil has Ed place it right next to Leprechaun, next on Pot of Gold, Next on under the Irish beer stein, and finally, the last face-down card is place under the hat.

As Ed reveals all the face-down cards, one at a time, we realized that each one, was placed directly under the same card. The Pot of Gold is under the other corresponding Pot of Gold, the Clover under the Clover and so on.

Ed mixed the cards and Phil placed the cards, and each one ended up placed directly under it's mate.

This was really a wonderful effect.

Todd is up next. He shows us a Lucko Leprechaun scratcher Lotto card. Joy assists and gives states her lucky number: 33.

Todd scratches the card and tries to match 3 to win; although, the card does not say what you would win.

1st line scratched shows a 13, 1, 12, 7, that totals 33.

2nd line scratched shows 11, 8 12, 2, that also totals 33.

3rd line: 5, 10, 3, 15, which again totals 33.

4th and last line: 4, 14, 6, 9 totaling 33.

Todd then shows us that if you add the numbers in each column, the column totals also equal 33.

And the kicker, the total numbers in the diagonals also total 33.

Todd scratches lucky bonus number and it is 33 too.

Todd let us know that these are available from Hocas Pocas, and you get a packet of 30 or 40 cards.

Next up was Julian, Robert volunteered. He stopped Julian at the 3 hearts. Julian shows card with black clover on back; suddenly, Julian rubs clover gone and it appears on Robert's chosen card. Great use of a color change!

Joyce is up next and shows us an empty square box, which in the spirit of St. Patrick's Day represents the Blarney stone, Joyce sticks an empty cylinder inside the box.

She then proceeds to pull a Leprechaun out of the box, and subsequently pulls a green hat out of the box.

We all see that the box and cylinder are empty.

Yet, Joyce proceeds to continue to keep pulling items out of the box, a bottle of Irish whiskey, then a green tree, a Leprechaun, and it doesn't stop there....Joyce pulls out an empty black bag w/gold trim; and then she pulls out gold coins from bag.

Then for the finale, Joyce pulls out rainbow ribbon with small pot of gold at end. This

Mel Bennett is up next to perform The Vanishing Leprechaun.

Mel shows us picture of a landscape populated by many leprechauns. There were 15 leprechauns in total.

As Mel recites the magical phrase, "One went over the hill", and gently moves the landscape. Another count of the population reveals that one leprechaun has left the area.

Where did he go?

Another few magical poetry lines are spoken by Mel, "Through the woods, over the hill", thus, a subsequent count of the population equals 15 leprechauns; the unaccounted for missing leprechaun is no longer missing.

Mel gave us some history of this type of illusion. Although, this particular trick was made in 1968. It's in the category of **Geometric Vanishes** and these tricks go back over 100 years.

I did not know what these were called; however, I can remember seeing many various version and themes of geometric vanishes years ago in everything from coloring books or books about art. It was interesting to find out how long these have been around.

Mel suggested the book, Mathematics, Magic and Mystery book by Martin Gardner



which has 2 chapters devoted to geometric vanishes.

Sam Lloyd is one of Americans greatest Puzzle creators.

Todd Reis returns with a bunch of red backed bicycle cards, with letters on the front.

Todd mixes them, some face up and some face down.

Todd holds 2 at a time, one up and one down. Flips or lays down.

Now a bunch of face up and face down'

Todd deals into 2 piles.

Julian says which pile to put on top of the other pile.

He extracts the face down cards out.

They are revealed to spell J U L I A N.

It is David Regal's Letter Perfect. Very cool.
