February Lecture and Workshop

This month's lecture will feature Harrison and will cover foundational and fundamental card magic with an emphasis on performance. It will combine a lecture and workshop to teach us some incredible magic. You will learn the what, when, why, where and how of a trick. These essential elements of a performance which can elevate a card trick into card magic. You will leave this lecture with some great new tools in your magic arsenal.

Bring a deck of cards (Poker or Bridge size okay) to the hands-on lecture of some pretty cool card magic. Prepare to be actively involved in this card magic workshop. Although not required, a close-up mat is recommended.

Magic Sessions -

February will be Harrison's 3nd magic session, read below for a recap of January's session.



Harrison reached back into the archives to teach us some wonderful card magic from The Complete Magician by Greer Maréchal, Jr. Over a dozen of us learned a great card trick as well as a nice alternative handling of the Glide sleight. The improved handling was less angle sensitive than the more common handling of this sleight.

Here's how it went down. Harrison requested a spectator to join him up front and to choose a card, preferably not a face card, and Harrison wrote down a prediction on the card; afterwards, he spread the cards along the table, and the audience member then inserted this card anywhere into the spread. The spectator pushes the spread together. The cards were cut. The cards were cut again and again. Harrison gathered up the cards and then spreads the cards in his hands and asks the spectator to remove the 3 cards (the prediction card and its neighbors). Harrison places the remainder of the deck on the table. The spectator hands Harrison the 3 cards. Harrison 1st shows the spectator the prediction card amongst it's 2 neighboring cards and the spectator is very surprised; at this moment, Harrison places the cards on the table revealing to everyone in the audience this impossible prediction naming which two cards the chosen card would be placed.

Upon retrieving the card inscribed with the prediction along with the card before and after that card in the spread; the prediction corrected named those neighboring cards.

These sessions are for magicians only. Harrison will guide session attendees in a focused and concentrated manner to maximize the magicians learning experience.

Attendees at these sessions have seen that Harrison possesses the chops to deliver a really solid learning experience. His performance with a deck of cards is simply flawless in both technique and presentation.

Sessions will begin at 6:30 and last to approximately 7:15 prior to the monthly club meeting, this will give us plenty of time to learn some powerful magic.

You'll need to bring 7 pennies to February's session!

Fun Fact: After writing Magic for the Million in 1957 (republished later as The Complete Magician in 1977), Magician Greer Maréchal, Jr operated the Carousel Food and Fun Park at the 1964-65 New York's World Fair having assembled the carved wooden horses from the old carousel which used to run in Coney Island, New York.

January Showcase

Robert performed Derek Dingle's Too Many Cards. I mean, we all have only 2 eyes and there are 52 cards, after all.

Bill gave us his version of Twisting the Aces.

Ed gave us an impossible card location where a spectator selects a number which indicates a card location in the deck. After multiple cuts and shuffles, the selected card is found at the selected location in an entirely different deck.

Mel gave us some insight into the construction of the pyramids, from tunneling, to storage needs (remember to post security to storage entrances to prevent pyramid brick disappearances).

Ralph MacIntosh shuffled and cut the cards ending with a Royal Flush.
