June Lecture

This month's lecture, Mental Mysteries with Pasteboards Lecture by Harrison taught us three powerful tricks with a deck of cards.

The first trick, Harrison acted as a human lie detector, a skill he learned from watching Judge Judy.

Harrison riffles through as deck of pasteboards and has Nick and Dan each select cards,



The cards are show to everyone and set face down on the table; then the cards are put into the deck which is cut and mixed.

Harrison asks Dan to answer a bunch of questions in which he must answer truthfully. The last question, is the card Odd or Even. Dan says, Odd, Harrison counts the cards down onto the table while spelling O D D revealing the last card the be Dan's card the Ace of Diamonds.

Next, Harrison asks Nick the same questions in which he must lie when answering; but, in the end, it did not matter, revealing Nick's card the Seven of Hearts.

The next trick was an example of Numerology.

Bill, Ken and Ed all volunteered to assist in a demonstration of the influence of Numerology of everything.

Harrison begins by choosing 3 target cards for Bill, Ken and Ed, placing them on table.

As Bill, Ken and Ed are all asked to think of numbers. Harrison counts down to the chosen numbers for each and top of each respective pile.

Harrison turns over top cards of all 3 piles 7 hearts, Ace Clubs, 5 hearts. Followed by the bottom of the piles resulting in 7 Hearts on top of 7 Diamonds Ace clubs on top of Ace Spades 5 Hearts on top of 5 Diamonds.

And for the last trick,

Harrison talks about being a Psychic.

With a honest shuffled deck, Brad, Nick, Robert and Dan stopped Harrison at various cards.

All 4 randomly selected cards were placed on table as rest of the deck is shuffled. Harrison was not privy to the identity of those cards.

Those cards are placed into different parts of deck and the deck is fairly shuffled again; and still Harrison finds all the cards.

And for the encore....

A deck was honestly shuffled, for those magicians out there, no false shuffles were used during this effect. A number between one and ten was thought of, and the card at that position was remembered.

The deck was cut, the cut was completed.

Another spectator provided a random number between 10 & 20, the cards were counted down to the first number—the thought-of card was not there. Harrison continued to count down to the 2^{nd} number and the mentally selected card was there located at the 2^{nd} number.

Now, to recap, a number is freely chosen, a card is freely chosen, a deck is cut before the 2nd number was even thought of!


Now, think about the impossibility that Harrison could have known to place the mentally selected card at the 2nd number?

References for these effects will be forthcoming.

Afterwards, Harrison showed us many of the books used as resources for the tricks presented here tonight. Most inexpensive paperbacks available. Thereby, showing that it does not matter where you get the material. Many of Harrison's paperbacks were Dover editions of the more expensive hardback books. All his material used in tonight's lecture had come from those books. Another important point is that many self-working tricks can be made into minor miracles when a little sleight of hand is inserted.
