Gregory gave us with some tips on how to perform this quick and really quite astonishing miracle.

Gregory likes to perform using common objects; his next trick utilized a common Bic pen. Seems this pen had the strange quality of its tip moving from one end to the other end.

He then performed Exact Change. Brenda assisted and thought of a random amount of change. That amount happened to be the exact same amount of change in Gregory's pocket.

Gregory continued the money magic phase of his lecture by performing Foreign Affair; a trick where a dollar bills visibly changes to various currencies right in front of our eyes.

This was followed by: Smoke from the Mouth, the Stretching Ring, and Split Focus (half-dollars 3-2-1 then 1-2-3).

Gregory finished up his lecture performing a coffee house favorite: Flick Stick. Gregory has a spectator take a wooden coffee stir stick and put



in into one of those single serve Starbucks dessert bags, Gregory rolls up the bag and has the spectator feel for the stick and then break in. Then suddenly, Gregory unrolls the bag and pulls out an totally unbroken wooden stir stick ready to be used to stir the next cup of coffee brewed!

If performed, you must remove the dessert from the bag first, then perform second, that order is critical for the trick's success.

The lecture lasted well over two hours and in addition to great magic; Gregory provided up with many performance ideas and tips.
