Harrison has been studying and performing magic for over 40 years and has known and had sessions with some of magic's heavyweights such as Charlie Miller, Ed Marlo, Larry Jennings, Bruce Cervon, Dai Vernon, Stewart James and many others.

He has a ridiculously large library of magic. This enables him to be very selective in choosing the best and most practical material, which can save the learners time and confusion of finding which techniques work best for different effects.

Session topics will range from card and coin magic, to impromptu magic with everyday items (bottle caps, cigarette papers, dice, paper napkins, string, and corks, etc.). Most of the magic effects will be at the basic to immediate level.

These sessions are for magicians only. Harrison will guide session attendees in a focused and concentrated manner to maximize the magicians learning experience.

Attendees at the club's September meeting, know that Harrison possesses the chops to deliver a really solid learning experience. His performance with a deck of cards was simply flawless in both technique and presentation.

# The Judges: Armando Gutierrez Harrison Kaplan Ken Sands



First up was Fernando Alvarez. With a volunteer from the audience, Julianne, Fernando first sculpted a magic blue & white balloon hat for Julianne. This hat along with a magic wand enabled Fernando to blend a red, white and blue silk scarf into an American flag. At first, the flag was not quite perfect, with the colors in the wrong place—this was determined not to be Fernando's fault; but, due to the wand not being

large enough, Fernando then allowed Julianne to use as larger and more powerful wand; still, the flag as not perfect; finally, he gives a huge wand to Julianne to wave across the bag of colored silks resulting in an American flag with the red, white and blue right where they belong.

Fernando followed up stuffing a green (GO), yellow (Caution), and red (STOP) silk into a tube, with a blow, the silk flew out of the tube all knotted together.

Finally, Fernando is joined on stage with audience volunteer Danelle. Fernando's personal assistant Morty the Monkey then attempts to read Danelle's mind. Danella selects a card with a letter on it and then shuffles the deck. There were six cards, each with a letter on them "A" through "F". The cards are shuffled again and tossed into a bag. Morty the Monkey reaches in and finds a "Z"; but, that was not Danella's card. Danella's card, a "Y" was in a banana bag she was holding the entire time.

Next up, Phil Ureno, as the Traveler, used a very special set of instructions to pour water into a copper vase, the vase was covered with a piece of cardboard, then turned upside down. Volunteer Julianne then held the inverted vase on top of her head, Phil gently removed the cardboard barrier, the water had vanished. Phil then attached a faucet to Julianne's head and was able to retrieve some water. Due to Phil's skill, Julianne



amazingly remained dry the entire time.

Julian Devero took the stage. Dropping several silks through a newspaper cone, the silks came out the bottom of the cone knotted together. Julian followed with a series of astonishing card fans, then multiplying billiard balls, he finished with a performance of the Vanishing Bandana with a shocker ending producing

an entire bunch of bananas.



Next, Brad Erikson began his performance with a very interesting 3 card monte; except, instead of cards, Brad used sponge balls; but these were not ordinary sponge balls, these balls squeaked; well, one of the balls squeaked. Samantha volunteered to assist Brad to locate the squeaking sponge ball; it seemed easy enough, yet, the balls seemed to take turns on which one squeaked.

Brad finished up producing a huge

candy cane, then, pouring peppermint and sugar into a pot, with a little mixing, Brad removed the lid and low and behold, a peppermint cake.

Our final performer of the evening, Ed Smith took the stage. Ed had a very nicely bowed red gift box in his hand. Inside the red box was a black box, inside the black box was a green critter of sorts. Ed then replaced the red box inside the black box. Which was quite strange since the black box was smaller than the red box?

Ed performed a series of rope tricks. Ed snipped off the ends of the rope, that left him with only



middles—3 middles to be exact. Then Ed again had 2, then 3 ends again. The ropes were various lengths until Ed stretched them to be equal.

Ed finished up the rope routine with a surprise ending linking three rope loops together and then unlinking them.



The Judges used a 10-point scoring system:

- 1) Introduction
- 2) Opening Trick
- 3) Deportment
- 4) Dress/Costume
- 5) Material/Tricks
- 6) Transition from trick to trick

- 7) Character/ Acting
- 8) Interaction with Audience
- 9) Speech/Patter
- 10) Closing Trick

After deliberation, the judges announced this year's winners of the Floyd Baldwin Stage Contest:

1st Place: Julian Devero
2nd Place: Brad Erickson
3rd Place: Phil Ureno

The Popular Performer of the Night award went to Julian Devero.
