Robert's communication skills continue to astonish and amaze everyone.





December's Celebration & Potluck


OCMC will have its annual Holiday Celebration & Potluck. All member are invited to bring a dish and celebrate. There will be an opportunity for Show & Tell*

Don't Sweat the Small Stuff

Yes, we should sweat the small stuff. The granularity. The details.

Author Robin Sherma said it well, "Moving from superficiality to granularity will separate you from the 95% of humanity that is stuck at average."

Think about the very best products that you own or want to own. Maybe a phone, tablet, computer, car, piece of furniture, etc. Think about that outstanding concert virtuoso, actor, basketball player, artist. Think of the amazing hair stylist or that perfect restaurant meal. Each of these products, performances, and experiences involved making sure that every detail was as perfect as possible.

I laugh to myself when I try to imagine Steve Jobs saying, "That's good enough, most people won't notice the remaining flaws," or Yo Yo Ma saying, "My cello is a bit out of tune, but only the musicians

in the audience will notice." Or Shin Lim saying, "The last phase of my matrix is a bit rough, but I'll perform it anyway – it will be good enough."

The chef doesn't accept substandard ingredients, incorrectly cooked food, flavors that are passable, or a presentation that isn't mouthwatering. The concert virtuoso doesn't stop practicing when it's "good enough." That new car doesn't have imperfections in the paint or loose steering that is "acceptable." The stylist listens to your direction and makes sure that you get the cut and style that you want.

In magic, think of the masters of magic. They pay attention to every detail. Their timing is exact. Their patter is entertaining and focused. Each move is perfect. Magic moments are amazing. Every detail has been worked out, practiced, rehearsed, and perfected.

The difference between the many and the best is in the attention to detail. The best study every detail and make certain that nothing is accepted as "good enough."


Take some time in the coming days and weeks to watch your favorite magicians. Watch their performances and pay attention to every detail. Notice the timing, their patter, their technique, their ability to control the audience. Study every subtlety. Then, make a recording of yourself performing your best routine. Analyze that video – focus on the details. Listen to your patter. Look at your timing. Watch your technique. Study the magic moments. What details are the weakest? What isn't hitting the standard of your favorite magician? What is making your performance less than it should be?

Sweat the small stuff as you work on your routines. Focus on the details. Make your magic the best it can be. Don't accept "good enough" and strive for being your best!

Let's strive to be our best selves and not settle for "good enough."

Move from superficiality to granularity to excel well above average!


